Marine Safety (Bareboats) Exemption 2020

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is Marine Safety (Bareboats) Exemption 2020.

2 Duration

This instrument:

- (a) commences on 1 July 2020; and
- (b) ceases to have effect at the end of 30 June 2025.

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

bareboat means a Class 4D or 4C vessel <15 m long used as a hire and drive vessel.

bareboat operation means any of the following activities in a bareboat operational area:

- (a) operating a service vessel for a bareboat, owned by the owner of the bareboat:
- (b) delivering a bareboat in a bareboat operational area.

bareboat operational area means an area to which bareboat operations are limited by the marine safety agency of a State or the Northern Territory.

4 Exemption

A person is exempt from the requirement to hold a certificate of competency that would be required for a bareboat operation if the person holds a Coxswain Grade 1 NC certificate of competency.
