Marine Safety (Sailing vessels with motor propulsion) Exemption 2020

I, Michael Kinley, Chief Executive Officer of the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (the National Marine Safety Regulator under section 9 of the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*), make this instrument under subsection 143(1) of the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*.

1 Name of Order

This instrument is *Marine Safety (Sailing vessels with motor propulsion) Exemption 2020.*

2 Duration

This instrument:

- (a) commences on 1 July 2020; and
- (b) ceases to have effect at the end of 30 June 2025.

3 Definitions

Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law — see Schedule 1 to the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012.*

Note **National Regulator** is defined in the Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law — see section 6.

registered training organisation has the same meaning as in *Marine* Order 505 (Certificates of competency — national law) 2013.

RYA means Royal Yachting Association.

specified operation means performing duties of the engineer of a sailing vessel that has secondary motor propulsion power <75 kW.

4 Exemption

A person is exempt from the requirement to hold a certificate of competency that would be required for the specified operation if the person:

- (a) holds a Coxswain Grade 1 NC or a Coxswain Grade 2 NC certificate of competency; or
- (b) has completed:
 - (i) at a registered training organisation the MARC037 or equivalent motor engineering unit of the Maritime Industry Reference Committee's Maritime Training Package for vessels with unlimited outboard propulsion power or inboard propulsion power <100 kW; or
 - (ii) the Australian Sailing–RYA *Diesel Engine* course and the Australian Sailing *Powerboat Handling* course; or
 - (iii) the Australian Sailing–RYA *Diesel Engine* course and the RYA Level 2 *Powerboat* course.

5 Condition

The person must give to the National Regulator evidence of completion of a unit or course of study mentioned in paragraph 5(b) within 14 days after a request by the National Regulator.
